Incident Summary:

• It was reported that Alpha Kappa Omega Fraternity has been functioning and recruiting members at SJSU while currently being a suspended organization.

Student Organization Code of Conduct Violations:

- (8) Failure to Comply
 - (C) Failure to follow all policies and procedures established by the University pertaining to student organizations, including fraternities and sororities, as outlined in the Student Organizations Handbook.
- (23) Violation of Student Organization Conduct Procedures and Sanctions including:
 - (G) Failure to comply with the sanction(s) imposed under a student organization discipline proceeding which may result in further disciplinary action and/or additional sanction(s).

Sanctions:

- Extension of Suspension of Recognition at San José State University until January 5, 2031.
 - The student organization, Alpha Kappa Omega Fraternity, is temporarily separated from San José State University for a period of, at minimum, five (5) years. They remain eligible to become a recognized student organization once the suspension has been served. During the suspension period, the student organization, Alpha Kappa Omega Fraternity, is to be inactive on campus.
 - Failure to comply with the conditions of the suspension will be considered noncompliance with this outcome letter. Orgs found to be out of compliance with suspension status will not have their time counted towards their suspension period. Additionally, failure to comply with the suspension

requirements may subject the organization to additional time until they are eligible to return to the university. Any attempt to operate as an active organization will affect the timeline for recognition and the eligibility of the chapter to return to campus. This includes but is not limited to, recruiting potential new members during the suspension period or operating under the guise of a different club or organization on campus.

• Suspension of Recognition is entered on the Student Involvement website (i.e., "Recognized Student Organization (RSO) Conduct"), with beginning and end dates.
